# Q&A about the Oralscope Device

## What is the difference between the small, medium and large mirror, and what should I order?

You receive all three sizes (small, medium, and large) when you buy the Oralscope. The mirrors are designed for different stages of growth:

- Smallest mirror: For children
- Largest mirror: For adult males
- The mirror size depends on jaw size, with larger jaws using larger mirrors

## Where does the smartphone clip need to be attached on the phone?

It's attached below the camera, with about the upper third of the image left empty to take pictures of the airways.

## How deep must the mirror go in the mouth?

The depth should be such that you can see all of the teeth. It's a collaborative process with the patient to find the right balance, ensuring comfort and good visibility.

## Can you reuse the device?

Yes, you can clean and reuse the device. You can clean it with:

- Soap
- Disinfecting rubbing alcohol
- Sterilizer After cleaning, store it in a sterilized pouch or in your tool tray.

## What do I do with the picture after taking it?

Currently, there's no specific app for managing pictures. We are currently developing a solution to make the process easier

In the meantime, we recommend:

- Cropping the image
- Saving it to:
  - o Google Drive
  - Dropbox
  - o Email
  - Existing dental picture app
- Using it for education, patient awareness, documentation, or legal purposes

### What if I have a cheap phone with a poor camera?

The picture quality depends on your smartphone camera.

#### However:

- You don't need an expensive phone for good pictures
- The pictures are close-up and don't require extremely high resolution
- A good mid-range smartphone should work fine

## How do patients react to putting something in their mouth?

The device is designed for patient comfort:

- Anatomically curved to respect mouth shape
- Thick mirror edge to reduce discomfort
- Patient controls the process, which helps build trust
- Patients can see inside their mouth, which can be an upside

## How do you handle different patients like children or those with small mouths?

- Use smaller mirrors for patients who are uncomfortable
- Smaller mirrors are easier to stabilize but may not provide as flat a picture
- For children who can't control breathing, you can:
  - Use the small mirror
  - Warm the mirror before use
  - o If it doesn't work, you might not be able to take a picture

## What if I have questions after buying the product?
